


Reception Summer 1 Newsletter





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LETS GROW! & MAGNIFICENT MINIBEASTS

This term our topics are 'Lets grow!' and 'Magnificent Minibeasts'. We will be reading stories including; 'Jack and the Beanstalk', 'Tuesday' and 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'. We will write instructions when planting a magic bean, as well as writing about what we might find at the top of our own imaginary beanstalk.

We will be planting our own seeds and observing them as they grow in our outdoor investigation area. We will talk about what plants need to grow. We will also be observing caterpillars as they grow and change in our minibeast investigation lab.

We will observe plants and flowers and make detailed drawings of what we can see. We will also look at the work of Henri Matisse and create our own spiral snail pictures.

READING AND SOUND BOOKS

The children are continuing to impress us with their fantastic progress with reading this year. Thank you so much for your support in listening to them read regularly and helping them to learn the sounds and words in their sound books. Many of you who asked us at parents' evening how you could help your child at school will recall that we said if you have time for nothing else, read. Listening to your child read, as well as reading stories to them will not only help them with their reading skills but will develop their language skills which will also help them to make progress with their writing.

We collect reading books in **EVERY TUESDAY**. It is really important that children have their books in their bag on this day. We do our group reads in school on Tuesday and Wednesday so that new books can be sent home on a Thursday. Recently, lots of books have not been returned to school in time which impacts on our ability to do group reads in school.
