Dear Parents and Carers,

Progress Evenings (Parents and Carers' Evenings)

If you haven't already signed up for an appointment for next week, please make sure that you do this today. When you arrive at school, please follow the instructions below:

Reception Parents and Carers Enter school via the courtyard through the door to the left of the usual

door – your child's books will be available for you to look at while you

wait.

All other Parents and Carers Enter school via the door to the east stairs. There will be waiting areas

downstairs for KS1 (Birch, Hazel, Fern and Bramble) and upstairs for KS2 (Deer, Squirrel and Skylark) where you can look at your child's books while you wait. We will put signs up so that you can find your way around. Your discussion with Teachers will take place in your child's

classroom.

Appointment times are all for 10 minutes, if you need a longer amount of time to talk, your child's teacher will ask you to return at another mutually convenient time to continue your conversation.

Reception 2023

The applications for starting school in September 2023 are now open via Newcastle City Council. If you have a child due to start school in September 2023, please make sure that you apply online before 15th January, even if you have an older sibling already in school.

PTFA News

Due to the creativity and determination of the PTFA committee as well as the unfailing support of the whole school community, we have continued to fundraise successfully over the past year. The PTFA have supported us in lots of different ways, including by providing a new school jumper/cardigan for every pupil, buying whole class sets of reading books and brand new maths resources for use throughout school. We are currently working towards fundraising enough to complete the outdoor play area through the addition of thermo-plastic markings to make playtimes more fun and to help us to structure our outdoor time more effectively. We estimate that the cost of this work will be approximately £7000 and we are hoping to get the work completed in the spring term. The Christmas Fair is almost here (date to be shared by PTFA) and

we are hoping to raise enough from the fair to get to the amount we need to proceed with the work. The PTFA will keep you up to date with our progress and how you can help. Thank you for your fantastic support, as always!

Parking

On most days the car park is being used safely by the majority of parents and we are very grateful for your support in keeping our site safe. Please continue to park with awareness of the safety of everyone using our site. There is additional parking at the town centre from where you can walk up to school and we are continuing to work with the developers and Newcastle City Council in order to gain access to the park and ride/stride facility (previously used as the Covid test centre). If you are able to, please try to travel to and from school sustainably – on foot, by bike or by scooter. We fully understand



that this is not possible for lots of families and we will continue to talk to the developers about safer infrastructure around school to make this easier and safer. We will keep you up to date with our progress.
