Open Afternoon

On Thursday 14th July, parents and carers are invited into school for an open afternoon from 2.30pm onwards. This is an opportunity to come into school and spend some time talking to your children and looking at their work in their books. There is an informal event and there are no presentations or performances so you can arrive any time after 2.30pm and before home time. We are limiting this invitation to one adult per child in order to avoid over-crowding in school. If you have more than one child

in school, you can split the time and visit more than one classroom, or you could have more than one visitor and each adult could visit one child/classroom. We are really looking forward to seeing you and giving you the opportunity to see the new school properly.

Transition Days and Classes for Next Year

On Wednesday 6th July, Thursday 7th July and Friday 8th July, the Y4 children are visiting GEMS for transition days. You should already have information about these from GEMS. For the small number of children not moving to GEMS, other arrangements have already been made which you should be aware of. Please contact us if this is not the case.

Thursday 7th and Friday 8th July are also our transition days in school and the visits for new starters. On the morning of these days, children will be in their new classes with their new teachers and will be finding out all about next year.

Because we now have some year groups of 60 and some of 45, next year's classes will be slightly different in some parts of school. Please see below for our plan:

Reception Ladybird Class (30 children) and Honeybee Class (30 children)

Year 1 Birch Class (30 children) and Hazel Class (30 children)

Year 2 Bramble Class (up to 30 children) and Fern Class (up to 30 children)

Y3 Deer Class (30 children)

Y3/4 Squirrel Class (30 children)

Y4 Skylark Class (30 children)

The current 60 Reception children will make up the two classes of 30 in Y1. We are intending to move some children around slightly, now that we know the children and their needs. Miss Storey and Miss Bommel will be helping with this to ensure that all children have friends in their new class and that they will be able to play and learn well together.

The current 45 Y1 children will become two smaller classes in Y2. Although we expect that they will grow quite quickly because we will be able to admit new children to that year group. Again, we will make sure that all children have friends in their new classes.

The current 45 Y2 children will transfer to KS2 exactly as they would have done previously so that the youngest 30 children will become Deer Class and the oldest 15 children will become Squirrel Class with the youngest 15 Y4 children.

The current 45 Y3 children will transfer to Y4 exactly as they would have done previously so that the youngest 15 children will become Squirrel Class with the oldest 15 Y3 children and the oldest 30 will become Skylark Class.

Staff news

We have recently welcomed Nicola Franklin to the staff team. Mrs Franklin has joined us as a teaching assistant and is working in KS2 to support learning.

We have also appointed a new teacher, Miss Jane Elvin. Miss Elvin will be teaching in Reception (Ladybird Class) in September and we were delighted that she could join us for the welcome meeting earlier this week.

We will confirm who your child's teacher will be on her/his annual report. Of course, by that time, children will have met their new teachers and will be able to tell you exactly who is who and where everyone is!

Covid Restrictions and Mitigations
