As you know, spellings are an integral part of writing and I would appreciate your help in encouraging your child to learn the spellings set each week, to enable them to use them in their writing. The children will receive new spellings to learn on a Thursday in their planner and they will be assessed on them the following Thursday.

In order for children to understand the maths curriculum as we progress throughout the year, they must have a solid grasp of their times tables. The children will be assessed on their times tables often. If you could practise these with the children at home and also encourage them to use Times Tables Rockstars through the internet then that would also be fantastic. You will find their username and password stuck in the front of their planner.

Homework will be given out on a Friday using either Seesaw or homework books. Please complete the homework by the following Tuesday to be marked. It is important that the children take care with their homework and present it as they would in the classroom, to the best of their abilities.

The children will read for 30 minutes at the start of the day, 20 minutes at the end of the day and will read individually as often as possible. It is very important that they read on a daily basis at home, too. Please make sure your child has their book and planner every day so that they are ready to read and please record reading at home. We check the planners each week so that we can see what the children have read. If the children have finished the school's reading scheme, then they are welcome to choose books to read from the free readers' section of the Library or alternatively a suitable book from home. If any parents/grandparents/carers are able to come into school each week to hear children read, this support would be greatly appreciated. Please let me know if you would like to help!

PE will be will be taught outside on either the yard, MUGA or the field.

Our PE lessons are scheduled to be on a **Tuesday** and a **Friday** The children will need an outdoor kit (warm clothing, waterproof field shoes and spare socks) and a spare change of clothes and shoes as our sessions will often be outside.
