Anti-bullying Session for Parents and Carers

Our safeguarding consultant, Dan Tolan, has been in school recently to deliver anti bullying sessions to some classes in KS1 and KS2 and he will be returning later in the year to other classes in school. These sessions build on school's own PSHE curriculum and help children to understand safe choices and how to manage their relationships in school. We have arranged for Dan to deliver a session for Parents and Carers too. This session will help you to understand:

- The difference between bullying and social or friendship issues
- How to teach children to deal safely and effectively with conflict and how to seek help
- How to support children if they are experiencing bullying or friendship issues

• How to access support and further resources

The session will take place in the hall on **Tuesday 18th April at 9.00am** and will last for approximately one hour. All parents and Carers are welcome. We will put a Form on ParentMail so we have an idea for numbers to prepare the hall.

Yard Markings

The work on the yard starts on Monday next week (weather permitting!) It is likely that there will be some disruption to picking up and dropping off on some days. If this is the case, we will contact you and let you know. If you come onto the yard and there is a section marked off, please make sure that you don't allow children in your care to walk on those areas as this could damage the markings.

We are extremely lucky to have such supportive families who want to work with us to get the very best for all of our children. You are all wonderful.

Attendance

Good attendance at school is essential in all year groups. It sets children off with the habit and expectation of attending school every day and will help them right through their education. Sometimes parents and carers make an assumption that first school attendance isn't as important as attendance later on. However, the curriculum is fast paced in first schools and learning is carefully planned so that it is sequential and each lesson in each area of learning builds upon the previous lesson. It doesn't take long for children to develop gaps in learning and begin to lose confidence and pace in their progress. Even in Reception, each day builds on learning from the previous day and learning in all areas is affected when children are absent.

As you will be aware, we monitor the attendance of all children in school. Any attendance below 90% is described as 'persistent absenteeism' and we class this as being in the 'danger' zone. Between 90% and 94% is classed as the 'at risk' zone.



Red – Danger Zone - Below 90%

Amber – At Risk Zone – 91% - 94%

Green – Safety Zone – 95% - 100%

At progress evenings next week, your child's class teacher will let you know your child's percentage attendance this year and discuss how this might be impacting upon their learning. Mr Burnett or I will be available on the evenings, or can be contacted on a separate occasion if you would like to discuss this further.

We are meeting with our attendance officer from Newcastle City Council after the Easter holiday to look at our data and follow up with families where we have a concern.

Multiplication Tables Check

All Year 4 children will take part in the statutory Multiplication Tables Check in June. You can read more about the check here <u>Parents and Carers' Information for MTC</u> Mr Burnett has arranged a meeting for parents and carers so that he can explain how the check is administered and how the results are used. He will also share ideas for how you can help to practise and build confidence at home. This will take place on Wednesday 19th April at 2.45pm and is open to all parents and carers of children in Year 4.

Progress Evenings

These are taking place next week and almost all of you have booked appointments. If you haven't booked yet, please contact the school office. If you cannot make it into school on the allocated evenings, please contact the office and we will try to find a mutually convenient time for you to catch up with your child's teacher. Thank you.
