Parking and Park and Ride

We know that parking on site is very difficult at drop off and pick up times. The situation is made worse by the lack of parking around the site and the necessity for lots of parents and carers to drive. We always encourage sustainable travel to and from school and we hope that many of you will continue to walk, scoot and cycle. Well done to those of you who brave the weather every day! We are working with Newcastle City Council and Newcastle Great Park Consortium to accelerate the reopening of the park and ride facility and we understand that there is ongoing work to establish a continuous path on the north side of the road from school to the park and ride site. This will create a safe space to park and a safer route into school which will become even more essential as we expand in numbers and have a larger staff team. We will keep you up to date with any news.

In the meantime, please take extreme care when entering the school site and using the car park by:

- Observing the 5mph limit
- Parking only in the bays or safely in the bus turning area if open (but do not block in other drivers)
- Only turning left out of the site (there is a large NO RIGHT TURN marked on the road which is currently largely ignored)
- Stopping at the pedestrian crossings if anyone is waiting or approaching to cross
- Being aware of small children who might be difficult to spot, especially on dark winter mornings and afternoons

When you are on site, we ask that you are curteous and polite to other site users, drivers and pedestrians while always modelling positive behaviour to children. Please be aware of the school safety zone and the double yellow lines around our site when you are parking off site. Thank you.

Spare Clothes

We have an ever diminishing supply of spare tights, socks and underwear in school. These items are essential for days when children have toiletting accidents, water spillages or after splahing in puddles and falling onto the wet yard. We'd be grateful for donations of clean unwanted items which we could use. If you are given any spare clothes by school following a messy incident, please return them, washed, to us when you can.

They overcame fears, pushed themselves to try new things, worked as teams, laughed a lot and celebrated each others achievements for three days and two nights.
