## Challenge, Equality & Opportunity

### COVID-19 Update

We are really grateful for your ongoing support. We know that we are all now suffering from information overload and the messages seem to get muddier every day. The biggest confusion seems to be around testing, symptoms and school attendance. As a summary, and based on your most frequently asked questions, here's what you need to know:

- Children with symptoms should not be in school, ring us if you are unsure
- Everyone with symptoms should have a PCR test – booked online
- A LFD test (home tests) are not suitable for people with symptoms – they do not reliably tell you that you don't have COVID
- Children are presenting with different symptoms to the three listed NHS symptoms, so caution around symptoms is advised
- We will let you know when we have had a confirmed case in school but we no longer inform you if we think your child has been a close contact
- If someone in your household has COVID, other people in the household can attend work and school – they will need a PCR test but don't have to self-isolate while waiting for the result
- We will change our practice and introduce new measures if we meet the thresholds set out in our contingency plan (available on the school website)

I hope that is helpful – please ring us if you have a question and we will do our best to advise you.

#### Harvest



We are hoping to have a very scaled down, but still wonderful, harvest celebration this year. The Year 4 children are going to present the harvest assembly, as they usually would, and one parent/carer from each Year 4 family is welcome to attend. Other children in school will not be part of the audience. Parents and carers will be able to enter and exit directly to and from the hall and we will

try to space out the 45 chairs as much as we can. We will ask you to wear a mask (unless exempt) as the guidance for schools states that we should wear masks in school in busy environments when we are mixing with others with whom we wouldn't usually mix/work.

We will still continue to have a food collection for the Salvation Army and the West End Food Bank and the whole school will be able to see all of the collection in the hall as we will have KS assemblies during the week and will share the important messages of gratitude and sharing.

The Y4 Harvest is planned to take place on **Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> October at 2.45pm**. If we have to change these plans, we will let you know immediately. Fingers crossed!

All children can start to bring food (eg. tins, packets, jars) in for our collection from **Monday 18<sup>th</sup> October**. Thank you.

### Times Tables Rock Stars



Key Stage Two children now have access to Times Tables Rock Stars and are able to use this resource in school and at home. Their usernames and passwords are in their planners and they should know how to log on as we have been working on it in school over the last couple of weeks. It is a super fun way of engaging with the multiplication tables. They can also challenge their friends and even their teachers with enjoyable activities linked to their times tables. The children earn coins when they answer calculations correctly and are able to purchase new instruments and outfits with these coins. It is an excellent resource which aids their learning in a key objective for maths in Key Stage Two. We hope that you are able to enjoy it at home too. Thank you.

## **Medication in School**


