Homework/Handwriting:

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Thank you for all of your support with homework last half term.

Writing and handwriting is a huge priority for us in Year One. We are finding that many children are struggling with correct letter formation. We have noticed lots of reversals including the letters 's' 'p' 'z' and 'j' -b' and 'd' are often commonly confused and we regularly refer to the image above to help us to remember the correct formation. You can support us with this by ensuring that, when writing at home, children form their letters correctly; hold their pencil using the correct grip and write letters the correct relative size to one another. Please do also correct any reversals, including numbers.

We continue to work hard to ensure that the children are happy and settled and as ever communication between home and school is key. We look forward to meeting with you at the progress meetings on 7th/8th November, but please do not hesitate to pop in and see us or to contact us by telephone if you have any queries or concerns.

We are also usually available after school.
